Motion by Rudolph, second by Walker to approve the following city employee wage increases: Robert Schroeder received an hourly increase of 50¢. Norm Dudley, Dee Jay Byerly, and Katie Shell received 2% increases. Wages become effective July 1st, 2006 for FY 2006-2007.

Motion by Umbaugh, Second by Walker to set a Public Hearing on February 14th, 2006 at 7:00 PM at City Hall for the purpose of adopting the 2006-2007 fiscal year budget. APVA/MC. The proposed budget will be published in accordance to state laws in the February 1st, 2006 edition of the Scranton Journal.

Mayor Boyd set the Street Committee of RECK, Rudolph.

Miscellaneous items discussed included changing the scheduled workday hours for Norm Dudley and Dee Jay Byerly, tax abatement regarding Dallas Warnke business expansion, construction of an apartment complex for which bids will be sought, and Trees Forever.

February 14, 2006

Mayor Boyd called the meeting to order at the Scranton City Hall at 7:00 PM.

Motion by Walker, second by Wright to approve the January 17th council minutes. APVA/MC

This was the time and place to hold a public hearing on the proposed fiscal year 2006-2007 budget. There were no written comments received for the budget. Numerous oral comments were received from the Scranton Library Board of Trustees and Friends of the Library to express their disappointment in the council for not giving the library additional funding for FY 2006-2007. Al Robson referred to the January 17th minutes regarding the council's decision for the library to use interest income from the Marchant donation. Robson expressed that the Library Board of Trustees denied such suggestion in the previous year and remains with that denial. Robson also stated that due to rising utility costs the library may have to cut operating hours, supplies, services, etc. The council provided suggestions of avenues the library could take advantage of to increase funding. Some of these avenues included grants, fund raising, and special tax levies. Sarah Stephens will investigate those opportunities further. The Library Board of Trustees asked for an explanation of why the council did not allow additional funding for the library in FY 2006-2007. The council explained that due to budget cuts at the State level, additional funding in the city's budget could not be given to several funds, including the library and that some other funds were in fact cut. Other oral comments were received and discussed. Motion by Umbaugh, second by Reck to close the public hearing. APVA/MC.

Amy Christian requested the council revise the proposed FY 2006-2007 budget and allow additional funding for the library. The Library Board of Trustees would like to receive the full \$1090.00 asked for previously, but would appreciate whatever amount the council could allow.

Motion by Reck, second by Umbaugh to revise the FY 2006-2007 budget to allow additional funding for the library. Aye: Reck, Umbaugh. Nay: Rudolph, Wright, Walker. Motion failed.

Resolution 2006-1: The annual budget for FY 2006-2007 as set forth in the budget summary certificate and in the detailed budget in support thereof showing the revenue estimates and appropriation expenditures and allocations to programs and activities for said fiscal year is adopted. **Now therefore, be it resolved**, the clerk shall make filings required by law and set up the books in accordance with the summary and details adopted. Motion by Walker, second by Wright to approve the FY 2006-2007 budget. APVA/MC.

Norm Dudley presented his monthly maintenance report. Items discussed included sewer plant project, damaged yards due to snow removal, street resurfacing, city park maintenance, city well repairs, and tree trimming progress. The council has requested the city pickup truck engine be turned off when the water meters are being read or any other time the city maintenance workers vacate the pickup due to the high fuel costs. The council also requested that the city maintenance workers walk

when reading water meters rather than drive the city pickup from house to house. While they are reading meters, the city maintenance workers are also required to clean the street gutters.

Brad Riphagen, Trees Forever representative, gave the council information on grants available for purchasing trees for the city.

Robert Schroeder was unable to attend the meeting to present his monthly police report.

COUNCIL MINUTES

March 14, 2006

Mayor Boyd called the meeting to order at the Scranton City Hall at 7:00 PM.

Motion by Umbaugh, second by Walker to approve the agenda. APVA/MC

Motion by Rudolph, second by Wright to approve the February 14th council minutes. APVA/MC

Robert Murphy was scheduled to meet with the council regarding jake break nuisances. He was unable to attend, however, the council directed Atty. Rasmussen to prepare an ordinance for the next meeting.

Melinda Madison met with the council to ask that Scranton recognize one week in April as "Organ & Marrow Awareness Week". Motion by Reck, second by Wright to approve the week of April 1-8 as "Organ & Marrow Awareness Week". APVA/MC

Rick Morain of the Greene County Development Committee met with the council in regard to a tax abatement request from Dallas Warnke. Mr. Morain identified the business needs in the county, possible grants/forgivable loan money, and job training partnerships of which B&D Manufacturing may possibly qualify for associated with business expansion. Mr. Morain strongly encourages the city to grant Dallas tax abatement.

Dallas Warnke was unable to attend this meeting, but will be able to meet with the council at the next meeting.

Norm Dudley presented his monthly report. The new sewer plant is scheduled to start up on March 16, with full switch over within one week of that date. The State Board of Health will conduct an inspection March 15 at the water plant. Norm mentioned the need for a boat for the new lagoons to allow the city workers to do maintenance of components located in the centers of the lagoons. The council directed Norm to contact the DOT regarding traffic signs and their associated costs.

The council tabled review of the bid from Feldmann & Co. for the sewer project audit until further information is received from Region XII regarding costs.

The council reviewed the first section of city codes received from Region XII. Atty. Rasmussen will contact Region XII regarding discrepancies. The codes were not approved at this time. The second section of city codes is being reviewed for the next meeting.

Police Chief Robert Schroeder presented his monthly report. Items discussed included fire calls, armor vest back order, & complaints of dogs, snowmobiles, and race cars. Midwest Radar certified the unit in the police car, however, due to normal wear and tear on the unit, Officer Schroeder will seek a grant for new radar. Officer Schroeder completed handgun qualifications and OWI training in February.

March 28, 2006

Dallas Warnke met with the council to discuss tax abatement for new construction at B&D Manufacturing. Mr. Warnke explained that he currently employs 23 people and plans to start a second shift in May, which will require at least 5 more employees. B&D Mfg plans to erect two new buildings on the property in the near future which will also increase employment. Warnke is willing to invest in the town, including a café and/or housing units under certain provisions. The council suggested an automatic 3-year abatement with an additional 3-year abatement following the first three years if certain criteria are met. Warnke mentioned contacting the assessor's office regarding an assessment appeal in an attempt to keep his business taxes from increasing any further. If such appeal is not approved, Warnke requested 5-year tax abatement. Atty. Rasmussen will research the tax appeal with the assessor's office, however, Warnke must file the appeal and the city will show support in Mr. Warnke's favor during the appeals process.

A motion was made by Walker, seconded by Wright to introduce Ordinance #182: An ordinance adding Section 3-3-60 to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Scranton engine brakes and compression brakes. APVA/MC
